## STEAM ROOM OFFICIALLY OPENED

Charleville CBS Primary school celebrated the opening of their new STEAM (Science Technology Engineering Arts and Mathematics) room during CodeWeekEU on Friday November 19.

CBS Primary is a Pilot school for the new Coding Curriculum and Tony Riley from the National Council for Curriculum and Assessment (who is also working closely with the school on this initiative) made a guest appearance to cut the ribbon and officially open the new facility!

The School STEAM Team were on hand to showcase various Coding and ICT projects that all the pupils have been working on since the room was set up in early June. A life-size talking Darth Vader, Lego and robotics, Haunted House animations and Ancient Rome built in Minecraft Education Edition were all on show on the day. All the children, staff and parents were treated to a '99' cone following the official opening! A great day was had by all!

The idea for the development of a computer room was first proposed in 2015. The Board of Management and Staff felt that the development of such a facility in our school would benefit every pupil. We are living in a society in which the use of computers and technology are widespread and our pupils need to embrace these changes and be taught the various skills required as well as the various dangers associated with IT.

Renovation work began on Room 7 in June 2018. 18 Refurbished computers were sourced from Green IT. Various other laptops, digital equipment, LEGO, etc were purchased also. Microsoft have also sponsored us a set of 16 tablets which can be used in the mainstream classroom. Our broadband infrastructure has recently been extensively upgraded so that we can now provide high speed internet across the school.

Our new Deputy Principal Ms Sinead Herlihy was appointed last year and has assumed responsibility of Teaching and Learning of IT here at the school. Ms. Herlihy has a very keen interest in IT and is doing great work with our pupils to develop their skills. Ms. Herlihy has rebranded the computer room as a STEAM Room. Science Technology Engineering Arts Mathematics. We are among the first primary schools in Ireland to develop such a facility with dedicated resources to foster the development of key skills and attitudes from an early age.

The development of this facility would not have been possible with the fundraising efforts of the pupils, parents and staff and the generous support of the local community.

Following the opening of our new STEAM Room, Adrian and Essie of DaVinci Creative approached the school regarding the provision of ongoing financial support for the new room. They have committed to providing a cheque of €100 every month towards the continued development of the facility.

# **Charleville GAA: County Champions!**





Charleville began their championship campaign on April 15 defeating Kilworth 1-14 to 1-9. After a long wait through the summer Charleville defeated Inniscarra 2-20 to 0-12 on September 9.

Charleville then faced rivals Fermoy in the quarter final and won by 6 points having played the second half with just 14 players.

In a high scoring semi final, scoring 4 goals, Charleville defeated Fr. O' Neill's by 9 points. Charleville faced Courcey Rovers in the County Final. After a tough, low scoring game it finished in a draw in Páirc Uí Chaoimh. The replay, a much more exciting game, was won by Charleville by the narrowest of margins 0-15 to 0-14 in Páirc Uí Rinn.

As a result Charleville will now play at Senior level in 2019.

The majority of the panel are past pupils of CBS Primary including Charleville's first ALL STAR Darragh Fitzgibbon!!

Charleville will now face Feakle (in the Munster Final on November 18 in the Gaelic Grounds, Limerick having defeated Lixnaw (Kerry) in the semi final!

We are delighted to announce a number of the players and management will visit our school with the cup this Friday at 1.45pm. All parents and friends of the school are welcome to come along and celebrate with us!
