two of our Chess teams who competed at the first round of the Ficheall Tournament in Scoil Aonghusa in January have qualified for the county finals!! The sixteen boys will represent the school in chess at the upcoming Féile Fichille chess tournament which will be held at Éire Óg GAA Club, Ovens, Cork on Thursday 5th March 2020.

This is a competitive round to which the best teams in Cork have been invited. Our Seniors qualified when our three teams came in the first six places in Mallow. Our Buds Team came in first place.

There will be gold, bronze and silver medals for the top three teams in the Féile Fichille. This is the first time we have reached this stage of the competition. The standard will be extremely high but Brother Ryan and Mr. Neenan are confident that our boys can compete with the best!

Ficheall.ie is a non-profit organisation led by teachers and principals around Ireland. Ficheall.ie's aim is to promote the playing of chess in Irish primary school for the social (respect, teamwork, conversation), cognitive (forward planning, impulse control, decision making) and mental fitness (accepting defeat, resilience, practice) benefits it has for students. The tournament is used to emphasise these values.

All the boys who are playing chess in the school are improving week on week and the boys are a credit to themselves, their parents and their teachers for all their hard work and dedication. A big thank you to Br. Ryan and Mr. Neenan for preparing the boys for this tournament over the last few months. We wish them all the best for what promises to be another very enjoyable day-out!
