Art	<p><u>Draw your silhouette</u></p> <p>What you need: Flashlight (and a dark(ish) room), white and black page, pencil, tape, crayons, A person to trace your silhouette</p> <p>Instructions:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Tape a piece of white paper to the wall in a dark room. 2. Place the flashlight on a table. Shine the light at the white paper. 3. Sit between the light and the paper so that your shadow appears on the paper. 4. Have a partner trace around your silhouette onto the paper. 5. Remove the paper from the wall and make sure your lines are smooth. 6. Next, cut the silhouette out of the paper and glue your silhouette onto black paper.

7. Draw different things you enjoy/like-food, hobbies, games etc. in your silhouette
