## Free Schoolbooks for all pupils @ CBS Primary!!!

We are delighted to confirm that all of our pupils will receive free schoolbooks for September! We have received a grant of over €18,000 to cover the cost. As well as providing all text books the grant will stretch to provide all workbooks and copybooks.

# Free schoolbooks for all primary school pupils



## Information for parents/guardians

From September 2023, **schoolbooks**, **workbooks** and **copybooks** for children in recognised primary schools, including special schools, will be provided to every child free by their school. There is no charge to parents/guardians for this, as schools receive funding from Government to cover these costs.

Schoolbooks, workbooks and copybooks will be provided by the school.

There is no need for parents to buy or rent these.

There will be no fee for parents for this.

Schools receive funding to buy these items. Schools must prioritise the use of the funding to cover all costs of textbooks, workbooks and copybooks.

There may be a requirement for parents to buy some additional items for children to use at school. . The schools must make this clear to parents. All children in the class will have access to the schoolbooks, workbooks and copybooks that they need.

The schoolbooks and workbooks will be on loan to the children.

They must be returned at the end of the school year, or if the child leaves the school.

It is important that books are kept in good condition so they can be re-used. Please help make sure your child/children keep the school books safe and takes care of them, so they can be used again by another child.

In Budget 2023, the Government provided over €50 million to eliminate the cost of schoolbooks for children attending primary schools and special schools.

## Where is our new school??



We were devastated to learn in March that our school was one of a number of major school building projects to be put on hold as a result of a shortage of funds.

We have been actively campaigning the Department of Education since **2014** for an updated and extended school building for our town. We have overcome so many hurdles since then and in 2020 managed to secure the sanction of a new building to consist of 10 Mainstream Classrooms, 5 Special Classes, 5 Special Education Teacher Rooms as well as a Sports Hall, Sensory Garden, Staffroom, Offices and other ancillary accommodation. The development was also to provide an additional 3 prefabricated buildings to consist of a further 6 classrooms to facilitate the new build.

We must acknowledge the great work by our local TDs; Michael Moynihan and Michael Creed as well as our local Councillor, Ian Doyle, in their assistance in ensuring that our frustration is heard.

We were informed over the Easter holidays that our project was no longer on hold. However, we are still awaiting further correspondence from the Department as to how we can proceed with the project.

Please lobby your local politicians! Charleville deserves better!

**Breakfast Club:** This gives our students an opportunity to have a breakfast which will hopefully set them up for a day of learning!


**Homework Club:** Monday – Thursday: This homework club gives our students a chance to have a light snack and complete their homework after school along with the assistance of school staff.

## **Standardised Testing**

Oh, we teachers love our standardised tests!! This year all pupils will participate in the following tests (subject to some exceptions):

- 1. **Drumcondra Primary Reading Test**: This is the first time that we have used this test. We previously used the MICRA-T. The Drumcondra Test is completed online. We feel that our pupils may be more attracted to this format. However, we are advised that pupils may not score as well on this test in comparison to the MICRA-T so please don't be overly concerned if you notice a slight drop in results this year.
- 2. **Drumcondra Spelling Test**: Our pupils have been using this test for many years and are well used to the format.
- 3. **SIGMA-T**: This is a standardised Maths test. Pupils in 2<sup>nd</sup> 4<sup>th</sup> Class will complete one test while those in 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> Class will complete two tests, the second test being composed entirely of word problems.
- 4. **Drumcondra Primary Irish Test TDG/R**: This is the first year that we are embarking on an Irish Standardised test. We feel that as a staff we need to raise the standard across the school. The results of this test will guide us and give us a benchmark to work from.

Standardised testing will commence in late May and will conclude in early June. We encourage all pupils to attend school every day as we prepare for these important tests.
